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1	ZOOM VIDEO CONFERENCE INTERVIEW OF WITNESS 2
2	QUESTIONS BY MR. QUINN:
3	Q I'll just say for the record quickly that
4	my name's Sean Quinn. I'm Investigative Counsel
5	at the OCE. Today's June 2nd, 2021, and we are
6	conducting the interview of Mr. WITNESS 2, and Mr.
7	WITNESS 2 is accompanied by his counsel,
8	Dirk Haire and Kristin Broz. And then, also
9	present are Indhira Benitez and Annie Cho of the
10	OCE.
11	So, Mr. WITNESS 2, first, I just want to
12	thank you very much for giving us some of your
13	time this morning. We very much appreciate your
14	cooperation with our review.
15	A My pleasure. Good morning.
16	Q Good morning. So our office is basically
17	just tasked with investigating allegations of
18	misconduct made against current members of the
19	House, staffers as well, and you're just a third
20	party in our review.
21	And so we'll just be having a conversation
22	and asking some questions about some of the issues

1 that we've been authorized to look into. Does 2 that sound good? 3 Α Sure. 4 Okay. Also, I think it's apparent from 5 the setup here, but this interview is being 6 transcribed, and also the video is being recorded. 7 We'll generate a transcript of this interview, and then that'll be sent to you and your counsel, and 8 9 you'll have an opportunity to review the 10 transcript and suggest any corrections if the 11 transcriptionist gets something wrong. 12 Α Okay. 13 And then also I know that you've been 14 provided a copy of the False Statements Act, and 15 we also had you sign an acknowledgement that your 16 counsel sent to us. I just wanted to make sure or 17 ask if you have any questions about that 18 acknowledgment or about the False Statements Act 19 before we get started? 20 Α No questions. 21 Okay. Great. And then also, feel free to 0 22 stop me at any time. If you have any questions

for me about -- either if I can clarify something 1 2 I've said or if you just need a break, feel free 3 to -- to let me know. 4 Okay. Thank you. 5 And then I guess with that, do you have 6 any questions before we get started? 7 Α No. 8 Okay. Great. Then if we could just 9 start, can you tell me what your primary 10 occupation is? 11 A My primary occupation currently is the 12 Finance Director for Cecil County, Maryland. 13 Okay. And then you also, I understand, do 14 some compliance -- campaign finance compliance 15 work kind of on the side? 16 Correct. I also own a compliance company, GOP Compliance, which has several state --17 federal, state, and local, and as well as party 18 19 clients; and I do campaign compliance work for 20 them. 21 Okay. Great. And are you currently 22 working for Representative Mooney?

1	A On an hourly basis.
2	Q Okay. And that's through through that
3	company GOP Compliance?
4	A Correct.
5	Q Okay. Great. Do you work for any other
6	Members of Congress?
7	A No. Yes. Well, no, not current members;
8	no.
9	Q Okay. And how long have you worked for
10	Representative Mooney?
11	A Since the beginning of 2019.
12	Q And how did you get hired on to his
13	campaign?
14	A I mean, I've known Congressman Mooney for,
15	oh, about 12 years, and Dirk Haire had been
16	working with Congressman Mooney on helping him
17	review some of his campaign finance reports and
18	asked if I would join the group in going back and
19	reviewing and possibly amending some prior year
20	reports to ensure compliance.
21	Q And what do you have a title with the
22	campaign?

1	A Currently, I'm listed as the treasurer for
2	the campaign.
3	Q When you say you're currently listed as
4	the treasurer for the campaign, where where is
5	that that you have indicated that you are the
6	treasurer for the campaign?
7	A On the most recent campaign finance
8	report. The Q1 2021 report lists me as the
9	treasurer.
10	Q Okay. And are you familiar with
11	Statements of Organization for campaign
12	committees?
13	A Yes.
14	Q Okay. Do you do you know if the
15	current Statement of Organization for the
16	Alex Mooney campaign lists you as the treasurer?
17	A I believe on the new committee, Alex
18	Mooney for Congress 2022, I am listed on the,
19	what, Form 1 and Form 2, as the treasurer.
20	Q Okay. I can I can pull it up and show
21	it to you. For the for the previous committee,
22	Alex Mooney for Congress, I believe it lists you

1	as the comptroller?
2	A Correct.
3	Q Can you explain to me why you were listed
4	as a comptroller previously?
5	A He had a woman who was listed as treasurer
6	and wanted to leave her listed that way.
7	Q Okay. Is that Betty DeHaven?
8	A Yes, I believe so.
9	Q Do you know why he wanted to leave Betty
10	as or Ms. DeHaven as as the treasurer?
11	A I do not. I believe she had I believe
12	she had been involved with the campaign for a
13	number of years, but I I don't know
14	specifically.
15	Q Okay. And then also, as I understand it,
16	from from previous interviews in this review
17	and also some of the FEC filings, there's a
18	company, PDS Compliance, that's also doing some of
19	the campaign finance work; is that correct?
20	A Yes. Congressman Mooney hired them in
21	early of 2021 to pick up their full-time
22	compliance work.

1	Q Okay. So can you maybe explain to me what
2	your what you do in relation to what PDS
3	Compliance is doing for Representative Mooney?
4	A Well, my role was to come in and and
5	help clean up some of the back reports and and
6	identify any mistakes that had been made, but PDS
7	Compliance is now, from what I understand,
8	managing the compliance completely going forward.
9	Q So now, with PDS Compliance, as far as
10	you're aware, you don't have an active role with
11	the campaign finance work for the campaign
12	anymore?
13	A I will have a minimum role at best.
14	Q Okay. Then let's basically, for the
15	remainder of this interview, we'll focus on the
16	period of time from early 2019 to up until
17	whenever you last had an active role. Actually,
18	can you tell me that? When when did you switch
19	over or when did the the transition happen
20	from you to PDS Compliance?
21	A I filed the termination reports for the
22	previous campaign.

1	Q Okay. And when was that?
2	A The Q1 2021 report which would be the end
3	of March.
4	Q So I know I've seen on recent reports that
5	you sign as the treasurer. As I said, on the
6	Statement of Organization, I think you're listed
7	as the comptroller. Is that common or have you
8	done that before where you're not listed as the
9	treasurer on the Statement of Organization but are
10	signing in the treasurer position on a quarterly
11	report or any periodic report?
12	A We had gone back and filed so many amended
13	reports, I don't recall exactly which ones I was
14	listed as treasurer and which ones I was listed as
15	comptroller.
16	Q Did you ever work with Betty DeHaven?
17	A No.
18	Q As far as you know, what is what's her
19	role in the campaign, or what are her
20	responsibilities?
21	A I don't know.
22	Q Do you know Peter Rizonsco [sic]?

1	A I do not.
2	Q So for the time that you were active and
3	working on the campaign's campaign finance
4	compliance, can you just basically describe your
5	responsibilities?
6	A When I was first brought on, I was asked
7	to go back and review the prior cycle's campaign
8	finance reports and help make help file amended
9	reports to those to that to all the reports
10	within that cycle. Going forward, I was contacted
11	periodically to with questions about current
12	reports and to review the filings of current
13	reports.
14	Q And why were you, as far as you know,
15	asked to go back and review previous reports?
16	A Because of my experience with the FEC
17	reports.
18	Q Was there was there a reason that they
19	needed to be reviewed, some specific thing that
20	you were looking for?
21	A No. There were a variety of campaign
22	staffers who were working on the reports, and they

1 wanted another set of eyes looking at the reports. 2 Okay. And I take it that -- or -- or have 3 you made amendments to previous reports since you 4 started that review? 5 Α Yes. 6 Okay. What sort of -- what sort of issues 7 did you identify that -- that require those 8 amendments? 9 In the -- in the prior cycle, there were, I guess, incorrect statements that -- for -- for 10 11 salaries that were then corrected and amended 12 1099s were filed with the IRS. And then going 13 forward, there were -- there were expenses that 14 were identified that were improperly categorized, 15 so we went back and amended those. And -- and 16 many times the corrections -- the amendments were 17 made to earlier reports, and so every time we made 18 a correction to an earlier report, we had to 19 update all of the subsequent reports because cash 20 balances changed. 21 Okay. On the issue of the incorrect 22 salaries, how were they incorrect or what was

1	wrong with them?
2	A Amounts were recorded incorrectly.
3	Q Do you know why that was?
4	A I do not.
5	Q Was that part of your review is to did
6	you try to identify why let's just take the
7	incorrect salary amounts. Did you try to identify
8	why they were reported incorrectly?
9	A No. I was told they were incorrect and
10	asked if I could help amend the reports.
11	Q And then you also mentioned that some
12	expenses were improperly categorized. Can you go
13	into a little bit more detail there? How were
14	they improperly categorized?
15	A I mean, specifically, there were items
16	that were either they were missing receipts or
17	were unclear whether they were campaign expenses,
18	you know, or other expenses. And to expedite the
19	filing of the amended reports, we removed many
20	expenses and had the congressman simply reimburse
21	the campaign for those expenses.
22	Q Okay.

1 It was -- it was quicker and cleaner to 2 just remove the -- anything that was somewhat 3 questionable, rather than trying to dig into it 4 and recreate what had happened. 5 And so were you -- similar question to 6 what I asked previously. Were you involved or did 7 you at all try to understand or identify why those expenses were improperly categorized as campaign 8 expenses? 9 10 I think there was simply just a 11 misunderstanding on how to track these field 12 expenses. There were -- there were staffers all 13 over the place, and things just weren't being 14 tracked carefully. 15 Okay. And so you found a number of 16 expenses where I think you said there were -- or 17 correct me if I'm wrong, but you found a number of 18 expenses where there were no receipts to be 19 located or -- or accounts underlying the 20 transaction? 21 Α Correct. 22 Okay. We'll return to that and dig that 0

1 on out a little bit more in a moment. I just want 2 to understand as you went through that process of 3 reviewing and then -- and then updating reports, 4 who were the people on the campaign that you 5 worked with to -- to accomplish that? Α 6 I worked with Michael Hough, Sophia 7 I'm trying to remember the folks before Murray. 8 Let me look -- I'll go back in my email and them. 9 look. Ted Dacey. 10 Can you spell his name? Q 11 Α D-a-c-e-y. 12 Okay. Thank you. Q 13 And --Α 14 0 Mike Hough, Sophia Murray, Ted Dacey. 15 I'm sorry? Α 16 Oh, sorry. Go ahead. Q 17 Oh, and Brandon Mahoney. Α 18 Okay. Q 19 And working with -- with Dirk Haire and --20 and his office and his team to help identify some 21 of these expenses as well. 22 Okay. Did you work with the congressman 0

1	at all?
2	A On occasion, but, no. I mean, there
3	might've been one or two phone calls.
4	Q Could you could you identify for me
5	so I know you went back to review a lot of the
6	reports. Can you identify the time period where
7	you would've been active in the initial reports,
8	so would've been the person to create and review
9	the first iteration of whatever periodic report
10	that was?
11	A I never created any report. I simply
12	reviewed them, but it would've started in with
13	the Q1 2019.
14	Q Who would've so Q1 2019 until the
15	termination report
16	A Correct.
17	Q or okay. And that's for Alex Mooney
18	for Congress?
19	A I believe it was just Mooney for Congress.
20	Q Mooney for Congress. Okay.
21	You said you didn't create any of the
22	reports. Do you know who did?

1	A A variety of staffers.
2	Q Would that have been the individuals you
3	just named, or were there more staffers that were
4	involved in creating those reports?
5	A I believe they were the only ones
6	Q Okay.
7	A but I'm not sure.
8	Q Are you familiar with the financial
9	institutions that the that the campaign banks
10	with?
11	A Vaguely.
12	Q Okay. Do you know who the campaign's
13	primary deposit account is with?
14	A I believe it's with Bank of Charles Town.
15	Q And do you know if the campaign uses a
16	credit card?
17	A I do not.
18	Q Did you ever review any spending that was
19	made with gift cards?
20	A Yes.
21	Q Okay. And what tell me about that.
22	What what spending are you aware of that was

made through gift cards?

A So in order to facilitate staffers

traveling throughout the district, gift cards were

purchased to give to them to use to -- to cover

expenses, and one of the things that we adjusted

was the practice of how those gift cards were

recorded. They were recording the gift card

expense. So if they bought a gift card for \$200,

they recorded the expense of the gift card.

And I explained they needed to actually save the receipts for all of the expenses associated with the gift -- purchased with the gift card and treat the gift card as a bank balance and simply report the expenses that were -- that were used -- that were purchased with the gift card.

And so that was many of the amendments that were made, and it's my understanding that the practice of using gift cards as a methodology for giving staffers the ability to purchase or make expenses, you know, while traveling throughout the district is -- is still being used. But, again,

1 the expenses are being recorded directly, rather 2 than the purchase of the gift card. 3 Okay. And do you know when that --4 about -- ballpark when that policy change 5 happened? 6 It was sometime last summer. 7 Just going forward, I might ask you about 8 a request for information that we submitted to the 9 congressman. Are you familiar with that request 10 for information or have you seen it? 11 I -- I'm not sure. There have been --12 there have been several, so I don't know exactly 13 which one you're looking at. If we're going to address that 14 Okay. 15 specifically, I'll call it up for you, then, and we can look at it. We've asked the congressman 16 17 about some gift cards purchased through St. Zita's Gift Shop or St. James Church. Are you familiar 18 19 with -- with those gift cards? 20 Α I am. 21 Okay. And am I right that those are to 22 specific vendors, like a gift card to a grocery

1	store or a gift card to a specific gas station?
2	A I'm not sure exactly what the gift cards
3	looked like or what they were for.
4	Q Okay. I guess my question is, I've seen
5	some gift cards that are are to specific
6	vendors, like Martin's grocery store?
7	A Right.
8	Q And then I've heard from other witnesses
9	talking about gift cards that were just, like a
10	generic Visa gift card?
11	A Like a Visa gift card.
12	Q Right. Exactly. And oh, go ahead.
13	A I'm not sure if these were merchant
14	specific or if they were generic Visa.
15	Q Okay. Have you seen both used by the
16	campaign?
17	A I I'm I'm not sure. I can't tell
18	which which was which.
19	Q Okay. So I want to talk a little bit
20	about the process of basically starting from
21	dollars spent to a report being filed and signed
22	to the extent that you're familiar with that.

1 If -- can you explain the process for 2 expenditures that are made directly from the 3 campaign's deposit account, so either through a 4 debit card associated with that or maybe a check 5 from the account? Just explain how that's -- how 6 that process works and what documents are 7 maintained through that process. 8 All expenses were made -- were entered 9 into CMDI, a third-party database, and were by a 10 variety of campaign staffers. CMDI's software 11 then generates the FEC reports. 12 Q Okay. 13 Α From there --14 When did --0 15 I was going to say from there, I would Α 16 review what was in -- what was on the FEC reports 17 to -- I really just was looking at the variety of expenses and -- and contributions and -- and 18

ensuring that the cash balance on the report

matches the cash balance on the bank statements,

but I've never reviewed individual receipts for

expenses.

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1	Q Okay. Do you know who would do that sort
2	of review?
3	A I do not.
4	Q You said the campaign used CMDI. Do you
5	know when they started using CMDI?
6	A They were they used CMDI the entire
7	time I was involved with them.
8	Q Okay. And then are they are these in a
9	different program now that PDS Compliance is
10	working on the report?
11	A No. I believe they are still using CMDI.
12	Q So would report or would expenses be
13	put into CMDI if they were or actually, scratch
14	that.
15	I want to talk about how how reporting
16	would work if Congressman Mooney made an
17	expenditure on his personal credit card and then
18	eventually that was reimbursed and reported.
19	How are individual expenditures made on a
20	personal card by the congressman reported on CMDI?
21	A I I'm not sure. I believe that the
22	congressman did pay expenses and then get

1	reimbursed for some of them.
2	Q But you're not oh, go ahead.
3	A Yeah, the the way it should be reported
4	would be the actual the expense then under
5	the reimbursement, the expenses associated with
6	that reimbursement are then tied to that that
7	reimbursement to the congressman.
8	Q You said, "That's how it should happen."
9	Did did you observe whether or not that was
10	happening with Representative Mooney's campaign?
11	A There there were incidences where we
12	did need to amend reports to ensure that happened.
13	COURT REPORTER: Excuse me. Please be
14	careful of talking on top of one another. If you
15	would like to repeat that last question, I would
16	be able to make a full record of it.
17	MR. QUINN: Sure.
18	Q (By Mr. Quinn) I asked did you observe
19	that well, I'll just reask the question.
20	Did you observe that that was that that
21	individual expenditure reporting was not happening
22	with Representative Mooney's campaign?

1	A If I recall correctly, there were a few
2	instances where we did need to go back and amend
3	the report to ensure that the expenses were
4	properly reported that were associated with
5	reimbursements.
6	Q Okay. Do you know why those the the
7	underlying individual expenses weren't being
8	weren't being reported?
9	A No.
10	Q Did you try to figure out why that was
11	happening or or where that breakdown occurred?
12	A I think I I you know, I asked I
13	explained why what needed to happen, and I was
14	told, "oh, okay. We didn't know." And, you know,
15	"We'll" you know, let's "Let's fix it and
16	make sure we do it right going forward."
17	Q Okay. Do you know if that's a specific
18	conversation you're recalling? Do you know who
19	you told that to and who gave you that response?
20	A No.
21	Q Do you remember ever explaining that
22	reimbursement issue to anybody in particular?

I -- I'm sure I did. I don't know to whom 1 2 specifically. 3 Okay. So we discussed that the individual 4 expenditures at times were reported through CMDI 5 or inputted into CMDI. Can you tell me about what 6 the campaign's document retention policies and 7 practices were? 8 No, I cannot. 9 Okay. Did you -- did you review Q 10 underlying receipts and documents related to 11 expenditures other than just the -- the reporting 12 in CMDI? 13 Α No. 14 Okay. Why -- why didn't you look at 15 underlying receipts? 16 It wasn't part of the scope of work I was 17 asked to do. 18 Q Can we go into a little more detail on 19 your review of past reports? Just tell me how 20 you -- how you began and went through that 21 process. 22 I would -- I would really just look

1	through the reports and look for anything that
2	looked unusual or out of the ordinary, and, again,
3	ensured that bank balances matched the report
4	bank balances matched the actual balances.
5	Q Okay. And what sorts of things did you
6	identify that looked unusual or out of the
7	ordinary?
8	A I think the the practice of the
9	expenses using gift cards was certainly one of the
10	issues that we resolved.
11	Q Okay. And then we discussed, I guess,
12	unitemized reimbursements. Was that another
13	A Yes, it was.
14	Q another irregularity? Okay. Other
15	than those two, any other kind of patterns of
16	irregularities in the reports that you identified?
17	A No.
18	Q I know you said that you a lot of your
19	review focused on ensuring that either amounts or
20	balances were were matched up or reported
21	correctly. Did you review whether or not
22	expenditures were appropriately categorized as

1	campaign expenditures versus personal
2	expenditures?
3	A No.
4	Q But you said that there were some
5	expenditures identified that you thought were not
6	properly categorized as campaign expenditures, is
7	that correct?
8	A Fairly recently, there were lists of
9	expenses that came through on an RF RFAI and
10	as then those were reviewed by counsel and
11	identified as potentially not eligible for
12	campaign finances, and the member reimbursed the
13	campaign for those expenses.
14	Q I think you just said R RFAI. Are you
15	referring to I might've introduced some
16	confusing terminology, but what is RFAI?
17	A Request for additional information.
18	Q Okay. Got it.
19	Who were those requests from?
20	A I I don't I didn't see the actual
21	requests. I was asked to amend the reports based
22	on the information I was given.

Q Okay. And so just so I understand your 1 2 role correctly, you -- all right. Let me ask it 3 more clearly. 4 Were you involved at all in deciding 5 whether or not something was a campaign expense 6 versus a personal expense? 7 Α No. Okay. And that -- did anybody on the 8 9 campaign -- do you know if anybody on the campaign 10 was involved in that decision-making process? 11 Α I do not know. 12 As far as you know, it was just counsel? Q 13 Α I really don't know. 14 If we could talk about some of the 0 15 individuals that you identified earlier, I'm just 16 going to run through them quickly. And if you can 17 tell me what you understand their role in the campaign is or -- or tell me -- or also and tell 18 19 me what you communicated with them about. So Mike 20 Hough, what do you understand his role in the 21 campaign to be? 22 He's the chief of staff to the member.

1	Q And what did you mostly communicate with
2	him about?
3	A Just he directed me in as far as what work
4	I was going to do for the campaign. So which
5	which reports to review, which reports to help
6	amend.
7	Q And then you also mentioned Sophia Murray?
8	A Correct, one of the staffers who was
9	entering most of the data into CDMI.
10	Q Okay. And what did you consult with her
11	about?
12	A She would ask about how to categorize
13	certain expenses and
14	Q Oh. Go ahead. Sorry.
15	A Nope. That's it.
16	Q And when you say "how to categorize
17	certain expenses," what do you mean?
18	A There'd be an expense and CMDI provides
19	drop downs for categories. I think there were
20	you know, there were there were contributions
21	made to local candidates, and she wasn't exactly
22	sure how to distinguish distinguish those. I

1 mean, some of the -- some of the -- some of the 2 odd -- the off expenses where she didn't know how 3 to -- what -- what FEC category to use for those 4 expenses. 5 Okay. And so she would come to you with a 6 particular expense and -- and you might discuss 7 how that would properly be categorized in CMDI or 8 on a FEC report? 9 Α Correct. 10 Okay. Do you remember any -- like, 11 specifically, any of those instances, any specific 12 examples of an odd expense that she was confused 13 about? 14 I think really the ones she had questions Α 15 on was contributions to local candidates. 16 Okay. How about expenditures? Do you 0 17 recall any specific expenditures that she had 18 questions about? 19 Nothing that we haven't already mentioned. 20 And then Ted Dacey, also, I think you 0 21 said. What's his role? 22 Α I don't recall his specific role with the

1 member. He was part of the campaign when we first 2 went back to review the -- the previous cycle. 3 And then Brandon Mahoney? Another staffer who was entering data into 4 5 CMDI prior to Sophia Murray. 6 So as you interacted with all of these 7 individuals and went back and reviewed FEC reports and -- and familiarized yourself with how the 8 9 campaign functioned and ran its campaign finance 10 program, who did you understand to be the people 11 that had knowledge about compliance with the FEC 12 regulations? 13 Please state that again. 14 Who did you -- who did you -- as Yeah. 15 you worked with the campaign, who were the people 16 that had knowledge of FEC regulations and could 17 give advice about whether or not, for example, an 18 expenditure was appropriately a campaign 19 expenditure? 20 I mean, I would say Michael Hough had 21 the -- had the most knowledge, but even then, he 22 would ask me for advice.

1	Q Okay. Did you get a sense of who
